Her nominated Charities would also benefit from the generosity shown by many at the various fund raising events held in support of the Mayor's Charity Fund. Particular highlights during her year of office included the Leamington Competition Festival, welcoming participants in the World Peace Run, the launch of Leamington in Bloom, the opening of Art in the Park and the unveiling of the commemoration to holders of the Victoria Cross.

She paid thanks to her Deputy Mayor, Councillor Barker who had ably deputised for her on those occasions when she was unable to fulfil an engagement.

5. TOWN COUNCIL REPORT

The Town Clerk provided a report on the activities and achievements of the Town Council during the course of the year.

The Town Clerk advised that the Council had continued to maintain a prudent budget ensuring that the support it provided to the community was balance with the revenue it was able to generate through the Council Tax precept. The Council had continued to maintain a robust Community Grant Fund which had supported over 30 organisations and awarded £39,800 in grants. The Town had once again been successful in the Heart of England in Bloom completion winning a Gold award. This was a good example of the Town Council working collaboratively with other agencies and volunteers for the betterment of the Town.

During 2019 the Council had progressed further with its Neighbourhood Plan having completed the first draft in January which was followed by a series of drop-in sessions throughout the Town. These responses would be used to inform preparation of the Plan which would be prepared for widespread consultation later in the year.
